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We have been promptly following NHS guidelines to implement infection control measures in the practice. Appointments are mainly conducted over the phone and Face-to-face appointments are booked by the consulting clinician as and when needed.

To facilitate this, we have been utilizing accuRx for video consultations and to exchange files with our patients securely through their mobile number. This proves useful to swiftly send blood test results and referral letters and also to receive images following telephone consultations to facilitate diagnosis.

We have also introduced e-consult on our website, providing our patients with a comprehensive online platform to request a GP consultation without having to call the surgery. This is usually answered within 48 hours.

Lastly, we have successfully met the targets for vaccinating patients under current cohorts and continue to encourage our patients to get vaccinated as soon as possible.
